Nashville: Cordell Reagon

Yesterday three people were arrested in Nashville during demonstrations at Tic Toc and Crystals. Len Chandler, New York (folk singer at Carawan's workshops) was arrested at Crystals. He sat in there from 11am until late in the afternoon when he was locked into the restaurant until a warrant was issued for him. He was arrested on the charge of Breach of the peace.

Albert Powell, 17 of Nashville was beaten at the Tic Toc restaurant with brass knuckles and a pop bottle. Freddy Leonard, 20, Chattanooga, and Randy McDew, Masillon, Ohio, were both arrested at Tic Toc. Both had been at the hearing on the injunction at Morrison's restaurant. They went to demonstrate during the recess and therefore were charged with contempt of court. Leonard is also charged with assault and battery (he is out on \$50 cash bond) and McDew charged with disorderly conduct by interfering with an officer. He and Chandler were still in jail at about noon today.

At the hearing on the injunction (injunction barring picketing at Morrison's) Lawrence Lane, 18, Nashville and Leroy Miller, 18, also of Nashville, were fined \$15 which they must pay within 15 days. Allen Philip Wolf, a white student, had been arrested in connection with the sip-ins. He was released because of lack of evidence.

A final ruling on the injunction itself has not yet been made.
