Minnesota Condemnation of Mississippi Democratic Party
The Minnesota State Democratic Convention unanimously adopted a policy resolution condemning the traditional Democratic party organization in Mississippi as "totally segregated." The resolution urged the Minnesota delegation to the Democratic National Convention to take all appropriate action to prevent the seating of the Mississippi Democratic delegates. It urged the seating of the Freedom Party delegation be viewed "with sympathy." Previously the Massachusetts, Wisconsin, and Michigan Democratic conventions have adopted similar resolutions. The New York State Central Committee and the California Democratic Council have done likewise.

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RULEVILLE, MISS. Ruleville Mayor keeps minister from attending church.

Mayor Charles Durrrough this morning told the Rev. James Corson, Methodist Chaplain at Stanford University, he could not attend services at white First Methodist Church here because, "you've come down here to live with Negroes so you can go to church with them." Rev. Corson and three white volunteers went to the Negro Methodist Church. Reported "warmly received." Corson is in Miss. under NCC auspices; serves as advisor to SNCC's Sunflower-Bolivar project.
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JACKSON New volunteer beaten on arrival at Jackson.

Steven L. Smith, 19, of 30-95 12th Ave., Marion, Iowa, was kicked down into the street and hit about the head by a local resident as he prepared to join the summer project. He got off the train from Oxford, Ohio in Jackson, and his suitcase was placed in the street by a local youth. When he went to get it, the youth knocked Smith over from behind, then hit Smith in the face. Three city police were present and questioned those involved. Smith didn't file charges. He will be working in research in Jackson on federal programs. Smith is sophomore engineering student at State University of Iowa.
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
