McComb, 3:50 - Went to know when lawyer is arriving from Merfolk to handle criminal syndicalists. Checked with LDG: they said either Marion Wright or Carmie Hall is going down this aft. Will call us back.

McComb: At Society Herald Baptist Church, Eserton (all Negre Neigh, McComb) Mass Meeting was expected, Sunday 3:30P.M. Purpose of meeting to hand over a check to Rev. Ned Taylor, for rebuilding another aspect of the meeting. Check for 1,000 dollars. Will be addressed by prominent Civil Rights workers and representatives of FDP. Aileen Quinn, she will relate her visit to Washington, and make it known that there is dissatisfaction by the community as to the action taken by police. Monday is Mrs. Quinn's birthday, Freedom Day. 5let. She is determined to get together at least 10 200 negroes and take them down to Magnolia court house to register them to vote. Mrs. Quinn says that she cannot think of a better way to celebrate. Civil rights workers will assist, and local sympathizers. Before going to court house prospective voters will be seen by Freedom School teachers, to help them with the controversial registration procedure. The applicants will also be told to ask the Registrar for a copy of their test sheets and their answers. As covered by the Civil Rights act. This is to help C.R. organizers build up a proof that Negro applicants are treated un fairly. 200 Negro voters would almost double the present voting force in Pike county. Monday Evening Freedom Rally; Designed as follow up to the voter registration drive, and as an official kick off to the Freedom Vote event. Principal speaker will be a Negro Hattiesburg House wife Mrs. Victoria Gray. She is a FDP delegate to the N.D. Convention, is a national committee woman for the FDP, and an FDP candidate, for congress for the fifth congressional district. She is on the executive council of the Southern Christian Leadership Council. The people will sit on a narrow strip of grass that crosses the Church Grounds. The Church was demolished by dynamite on the evening of Sunday, Sept. 2, 1964. After a similar explosion, shattered four of the five rooms of the McComb of civil Rights sympathizers, Mrs. Aileen Quinn. The Negro mother of three.

McComb Negro pattern

McComb ..5:30 Janet Jamet called us from Meridian to report that the car that Jesse Harris was driving from McComb to Atlanta has not been seen for an hour. The 2 cars were traveling together, and were supposed to stick together to Atlanta. The last time that the car Janet saw in saw Jesse's 64 Plymouth, green 4-door, carrying Theresia Del Pase, Marshall Goss, Jeel Martin, and Dennis Hussey. (Jeel and Jesse are Negro, the others are white.) was right outside Laurel where they also saw a highway patrol car stopping cars and asking for licences. They left McComb at 2:30, and last saw them at about 4:30. McComb CAN'T find any license number for the car. County Jail says that they don't have them as does the city jail. net also. Atlanta indicates that they may have stopped along the way, which is not unusual for these people. They will check Selma to see if they went through Meridian.

HARPS 6:25 Goodner is on gambling fine of \$100. two people had \$25 and one received none as far as fines. The appeal bond for Goodner will be \$200. Jd Powell is held on an old charge of shooting his wife and the bond is \$350. Abbot, Klondike is on \$350 bond for a stabbing that his brother committed. His brother is being held in juvenile on the stabbing. Name is Lannie Abbot.

Meridian 6:45 Jasper Sheriff doesn't answer. The Heidelberg city jail and police don't answer.

Valley View.....Charles and Green were at a mass meeting the girls had gone home. At about 9:30 pm. a white man driving a 66 Ford came to the Freedom House and asked for William Steel. About a month ago this same man driving a 57 Ford there, came asking the whereabouts of an old lady. He was about 18 or 25 years of age, reddish hair, reddish complexion, about 5'8", weighing about 130 or 140 pounds, and wearing expensive brown shoes. People became suspicious when he tried to prevent them from seeing his license number. People present were: Phil Sharp, James Williams, William Griffin, and Otis Burns.

Greenwood 8:25 The Parker family is being put off the Whitman Plantation. Plantation is 2½ miles east of Greenwood. Mr. McLeavis said he wanted the house by Monday. McLeavis is the overseer of the place. Told them about being forced to move and the Parkers have no money. Her cousin told her she could have her house at \$7 a week. Mary Parker was in jail this summer in connection with the movement and has been working after school. McLeavis has told them several times about what would happen.

Marks...9:25.. Leon Phipps reporting. Rep Marshall came by the office looking for James Jones. Marshall is from Oxford, and told them to tell Jones that he has to be in court in Oxford on the 19th.

Cleveland .. 1st PDP precinct meeting tomorrow nite .

MANKS: 10:00 Lawrence Epsy, LGDC lawyer, said that the county att. cawell that they would close the Freedom House down, said it was a gambling joint. The police came in without a warrant, found the kids playing black jack and one boy with a quarter in his hand for a soda. The cops took it out of his hand and put it on the table. Then charged them with gambling. Klondike was beaten in jail, on his wound. Not severely. Apsey gave this report.

JACKSON : 12:00; Spoke to Atlanta, Jessie and others are not there yet. Agent Puddister is in our favor. He might call the jails in Laurel. Probably not. I gave him the license number.
