

WATS: August 2, 1964

The following telegram was sent around 3:00 PM. from James Forman, Chairman of The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee to E. William Henry, Chairman of Federal Communications Commission, 3464 Macomb Street, Washington, D.C.

Citizens Band Radio Service License (KUY 1106) Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee wishes to report systematic jamming of Citizens Band frequencies in Greenwood, Mississippi on July 31, and August 1. Licensee is operating Citizen Band radios under temporary emergency authorization issued by FCC because of hazards to registration workers from vigilantes and other groups in Mississippi. Licensee respectfully requests that FCC undertake investigation of jamming. A significant increment of risk to life and limb of workers is added by the jamming. Detailed report of jamming incidents follows by mail.

WATS REPORT---via George Johnson/Sandra Stovall August 2, 1964
