I know about your problems with the officers of the law there in the City of New Orleans, and the Lord knows that I wish I knew something to do about it, but as of now I don't see a way out for us in this struggle for freedom and justice under the constitution of this country. "The night is here but, the morning cometh" that's all I can say.

Now may I get around to my problem-Three weeks a go the County Health Officer would not issue a permit to buyealliennee or so the person I rented the cafe to could buy a lisense there is not a thing wrong with the cafe, it seems that the white health officers here are mad about the movement and they are trying all they know how to put me out of business. Now don't tell me to see Mr. Gilliam, because Mr. Gilliam does not want to become involve with these white people. This I know. We might have to go to court to make them let us stay open for business in the cafe.

If you think it's nessary to take it up with a lawer please let me know.
