Thank you for the letter. Stanley Newman's letter arrived same time.

I've passed on your words about affidavits to Julian Bond who is our head communications man, and just recently became a notary public himself so he can notarize affidavits. There's been some talk about having a staff member in each state or project become a notary for same reason. Don't know when it'll come off though.

Thank you for the list of assistants, etc. We'll start sending them things soon as the next crisis blows, at which time I hope we're more organized for documenting brutality and so on. The Selma staff is doing a wonderful job of getting official statements, writing to the federal district judge about discrimination at registration desks, and getting statements about being fired for trying to vote.

I'm enclosing some stuff about the Freedom Ballot in Mississippi. You probably know that Aaron Henry and the Rev. Edwin King (white native Mississippian) are running on a write-in on November 5, and a freedom ballot the day before Nov. 4. We need as much coverage as we can possibly muster. Iim also sending the platform. See if you can do anything with it in the way of informing those who should be informed.

Casey was picked up yesterday in Jackson. But she says she loves it there. Lord knows what will happen next.
