

If Bob Moses lIves through this latest crisis in Greenwood, Miss. - I think we must show some steady form of support to him and his fellow workers. $B b^{\prime}$ 's father said when he was told of Bob's arrest and his having been bitten by a police dog: "Thanks for telling me about the Governor of Mississippi biting my son... Someone's got to fight.... I'm gonna be up all night... Ism scared to death that Bob may die... But I want him to stay there."

I am suggesting that sending a telegram is good - but not enough. I want tour help to form a core of people who will send five dollars a week to Bob - to ease his way - to let him know were hers supporting him (five bucks may amount to beans in NYC - but a bunch of them might make for a steadier diet, office supplies and any other fuel for the fight).

There are 30,000 Negroes in LeFlore County (in which Greenwodd is located) - 475 of them are registered voters. If there ever was a new frontier " there is sher it is - Bob \& the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) workers are there to stayitil Free Elections become a reality.

I'm going to find out the exact mechanics of how best to sand the five dollars a weeks. Let me know if jou'il join me in doing this. I want to extend wy hand to Bob-outilide of hing there, with hi l this is one way to do its:
P.S. From making this recent round of calls I learned that most of us really don't know exactly whats going on. We know vaguely about "the struggle $e^{\prime \prime}$ and when it comes to a head - but not about the day to day victories and setbacks. SNCC puts out a newsletter which I propose to send to all those who join thess- plus some info on some of the other plans that Bob is putting in motion in terms of mass education and literacy drives in the South.

I write all this tonight wile the situation in Greenwood is still tense and the future unknown - I hope tomorrow brings better news. I hope the day after that we can start sending reinforcements (greenbacks) to the front inn.
