II. LIBRARY

children only. The art and craft classes will be conducted in the bldg
at the same time.

III. SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN

The center is open for them from 9:00 to 3:00 and the activities for them
include a tutorial program (Negro history, literature, arts, etc.), and
supplementary programs (same as above)--this includes discussion groups,
citizenship classes etc.
