

Let the districts in Greenville be divided into five districts, with tentative deputy registrars in each. This week instead of concentrating on voter registration, efforts were concentrated on convincing numbers of people to appear at the courthouse on July 16th (Freedom Day) to register. Two mass meetings have been set up for Wednesday night July 15th, in order to reinforce the presence of numbers predicted as upwards of two hundred. The following towns outside Greenville are cooperating in the Freedom Day efforts: Island, Hollendale, Arcola, Avon, Waverley Springs, and Glen Allen.

Architecture: Directed by Charles Ashow, blueprints for constructing a community center have been drawn up. A meeting is planned for July 16th at 8 pm with persons who should provide inroads into financial support, property, and building materials and labor.

Freedom Schools: As a mate to the north end school, on July 13th, a south end freedom school has been opened; thus both Negro areas, the south and north ends, are covered by freedom school personnel.

White community contacts: Excepting those from Hodding Carter, benefits from white community contact have been negligible and advice in this area is requested.

Community centers: Increased planning for community center is occurring in the following areas: medical counsel and financial support. The placing of the center in the structure referred to above will be completed as soon as possible.

Finances: We are solvent. Account exceeds \$1000.

Summary: Of the above areas, the two most important are Freedom Day results which will test our effectiveness in the community, and the community center's construction, which will decide our permanence.
