Admittadly, this chronicle of phone calls is incomplete. It, however, indicates the pattern and type of phone harassment which we have received at the Greenville COFO office. There have been no verbal threats and, in the great majority of instances, the other party has said nothing. Since the middle of July, the number of calls per day has decreased to an average of two a day, in the middle of Angust. It is no langer a common occurrence to find the phone dead at night. The phone was dead two times on July 29 after calls which might have been interpreted as being emergencies.

B. To other individuals connected with the Novement white

- 1.) the last week of July, Koney Jay Schieffelin, a/summer volunteer from Short Hills (New Jersey), received a masher of anonymous calls at the house where she was staying (a Megre family by the same of Reed at 1009 Holmes Mt.). The caller kept repeating the phrase "blood is the life". Miss. Schieffelin subsequently moved to another house.
- 2.) the family of Dan Harris, TST Carver Circle, Greenville, has received a number of phone calls. Two white summer volunteers are staying at the house. The phone calls increased in number the week of Angust 9-Angust 18. In most instances, there was no answer at the other and. Snee, on Angust 18, a white woman asked if the Harrises took bearders.

II. Talk on the Streets

A. To COPO verkers

Whites have, as occasion, encountered COFO vorkers and asked them what they were doing and why. There have been no perious threats in Greenville. In the past of Washington County, white volunteers have been told to get off various plantations and that they were trospassing. They have done so.

B. To inhabitants of community

In Bookertown, in the southern part of Greenville, whites (who are mostly vomen in their 50's) have approached Negroes and teld them not to become involved in the movement. The whites have not been serious in terms of action and Norton Thomas, a white volunteer who routed inthat area of term, know of no threats.

ITL. Beatings

A. Ame Allan, a white summer volunteer, was slopped an inquest 18 at about 11:00mm by a man reported to be one Buddy Budd. Allan was, at the time, conversing an area one wile extends of Dunleith, Washington County.

IV. Threats

A. Farl Harris, a SHCC staff worker in Hellandale, was threatened with a range blade by barbby Farrell Stokes . This happened after Sarl had entered a white barbershop (Barl 1d a Negre) and had been hit on the neck by a white patron.

ARRESTS

1.) traffic violations

Fred Anderson, SNCC staff, arrested for driving without a license. Paid a \$21 fine.

Mrs. J. L. Moreton, inhabitant of Greenville who was housing two freedom school teachers, arrested for driving without a license shortly after she had lost here. She paid fine. Had trouble

getting a new license.

Larry Lockshin, a GMFO volunteer, in Mattiesburg for making an illegal U-turn. Paid 17 dollar fine.

San Applewhite, a Negro citizen of Greenville, a driver for COPO, anda Washington County delegate for the Freedom Democratic Party, on two trumped-up charges. One of forcing another person off the road outside Leland was dropped. The other, one of reckless driving, was also dropped.

2.) forgery

Willie Rollins, a Greenville teenager who was passings out leaflets in Leland on July 22. He was approached by police and asked if he had been at the Leland bank the day before. He answered that he had not. He was then arrested on having written or cashed a forged check. He was questioned for approximately 40 minutes and then released without any charge.

3.) littering

Louis Grant and Bob Wright, both SHCC staff members, were arrested on Angust 11 at about 5:30pm in Anguilla, Sharkey County. They were leafleting for a Freedom Day to be held Angust 12 in Rolling Fork. The original charge was leafleting without a permit. When bond was set the following morning at \$200 apiece, the charge was changed to littering. The trial is set for Angust 26.
