There has been a report that some dynamite was stolen from an oil refinery factory in the Hatches area--they are therefore expecting trouble in the area--possible explosions.

Another racist organization has been developing in the southwest Miss. area--the Adams County Klavern Religious Association. The group has recently put out a leaflet redbaiting both a local priest and Bruce Payne, who was a black Yale Student who came down for the Aaron Henry campaign and worked with George Greene.

George says that there are some black people in the white community in the Hatches area who are concerned about the pest and potential violence and want to do something about it, but are not sure just what.

Yesterday both swimming pools in Pine Bluff were closed. The day before a group of students had attempted to integrate the pool in the white park and it was closed down.

Enfield: J.V. Henry

In the primary elections in North Carolina last week no Negroes won in the primaries in Halifax county though some beat white candidates in the same area. Those whites who were endorsed by the movement did win however. The second primary will be June 27.
