Jaques Calma was driving his 1948 Chevy down Mississippi street in Jackson. When he reached the corner of President St., an unmarked police car stopped them and placed them under arrest for reckless driving. Kalman who is white, was taken down to the police station along with his two passengers. Bob Watkins and Jimmy Lee Wilcox, both of whom are Negro. Watkins and Wilcox were immediately released. Kalman, however, was driven a half a mile away to another building. The name on the door said Justice of the Peace. This was the only notification he had of whom he was talking to. The JP, the police officer, and some local people all went into the back room and talked awhile. When they came out, the J.P. and the officer went into a rambling discourse on the streets of Jackson and what Calma had done. From the discussion, the only thing Calma seemed to have been charged with was swithing from lane to lane. Calma told the JP that to the best of his knowledge he was not guilty of anything. He was then fined \$25 plus \$9 diff court costs. This, apparently was the first time he realized he was being tried. He paid the money, since it appears his only other choice was going back to jail and being booked and then paying a fine. He has been in contact with an LDC lawyer and plans to appeal.
