I consider the SNCC program in Selma and the Dallas County area to be in very bad need of revision. I view the movement here at present as being a Student Movement. I personally feel there will be no progress until the movement becomes a Community Movement.

I have presented to the Voters League an extensive plan for Voter Registration, limited planes for education and community improvement. I have received their full endorsement. However, I do not feel there is an organization that represents the majority of the black people on the low economic plane or the majority of the black people on the middle class strata for that matter. I am going to attempt to aid them in building this kind of an organization if possible and nothing is impossible.

Attorney Peter Hall of Birmingham, Ala. has been handling our Court Cases. I spoke with him concerning possible law suits and things look promising in this regard.

I have reopened our old office at 31½ Franklin Street and had the lights turned on and the phone installed (Phone 872-1426). I have also opened a bank account under the organizations name (SNCC) at the Peoples Bank.
