WEEKLY REPORT

September 28, 1964;

Tom Ramsay and I went to New True church in Farmhaven^{Light}-Milvell community to assist the farmers in their local community elections.

This person wasn't elected because of persons that these farmers had in mind wasn't present. Mr. Stokes and Rev. Smith subjected that this (farmhaven-milvell) election should be postponed.

Several persons was subjected to us concerning the chairman position, I personal believe that people are well revired to the importance of well trained farmer, who has ability to represent this community.

It was decided that New True Would be the place for pre-election October 9, 1964 at 1:30 o'clock.

Tuesday 29, 1964:

We rearranged the record of that issue, letters from difference branches of agriculture department, Land Bank of New Orlandes, and agriculture business school of Wisconsin. Ramsay and I discuss our own ideas of vary aspect we often do this.

Wednesday 30, 1964;

I thought it would be esah-easier to have difference committees to meet than have to inform every farmers about its meetings and have one monthly meeting, in this monthly meeting every committee to make it final report at the monthly Farmers. League meeting.

October 1, 1964:

It rain all that day, we waited for Wilbert Robinson the president of chamber of commerce to sign all letters for mailing. Mr. Robinson, was out of town on business. C. O. Chinn Jr., only local person we have in our Federal Program, he all so help Tom Ramsay with chamber of commerce. I all so recived a letter that Eface wrote to Wisconsin concerning a agriculture business manage. Professor Marvin A. Schaars of Wisconsin stated " I have talked to some of my colleges but we are unable to recommend a person who knows anything about cotton ginning or is able to mange a business of this kind."

Friday 2, 1964:

Rankin county, had it first farmers meeting George Raymond, Tom Ramsey, and I spoke at Mount Pisagh church. We sold ideas of progress in Madison county Farmers League: Importance of A. S. C. elections, poverty bill, F. H. A. and other funds granted by the Federal government. Cotton allotments and other program factors, such as productivity indexes, payments rates, these things are new to farmers as it was in Madison and many other counties.

Saturday 3, 1964:

Fourth district freedom rally was held at Dearons farm. Federal program had booths set up, we talked with farmer and anyone who had interest in our program. Mr. Farmer, Dr. Greene, Rev. Duley came here from Michigan State University.

Sunday 4, 1964:

Back to new True Light church--- fifteen farmers volunteered to canvass Farmhaven and Milville community. The elections of community chairman will be October 9 at 1:30 o'clock at New True Light church.
