Dear Sir:

I was first advised by the Mississippi Project "Parents' Committee" of the projected publication of excerpts of letters etc. from the Project workers, the proceeds above costs to be allocated, as I understand, to the work of the Mississippi Project. The material reached me while I was on vacation, and so many pressures developed during the month of September that I was unable to make the deadline and assumed that David's contribution would not qualify for inclusion. I have learned this week that McGraw-Hill has been in touch with him directly for permission to release this material, and here, finally, at long last, are the typed excerpts from his letters, plus copy of material in which he describes canvassing white voters in the area where he was working. David was stationed at Holly Springs, Mississippi.

I understand that it may in all probability be too late to include this material. But if not, you are welcome to use as much as little as seems to fit into the purpose of the publication.

I have added one or two explanatory notes which may or may not be helpful; and if the material is to be included, I shall be glad to answer any questions you may wish to ask. David was born January 8, 1945 in Visalia, California. At the time he enrolled for the Mississippi Project he was 19½ years old. Whether we make the deadline or not, I look forward with interest to your publication.
