Dear Miss Richardson:

Sometime in the spring of 1965 we will be publishing a book tentatively entitled <u>Mississippi Black Paper</u>. The volume will consist of a collection of some of the affidavits and statements gathered by COFO this summer, which have now been placed in evidence before the Fifth Circuit Court in New Orleans.

Among the 60-odd affidavits that we tentatively plan to run in the book is one by you, and I am writing to secure your permission for its use. I do hope that you will grant us this permission, for we believe that Mississippi Black Paper will help to further arouse the American public to the inequities of the law in Mississippi.

I enclose a statement from Bob Moses, director of the Mississippi Summer Project, as well as two copies of a permission form. Could you sign one of these and return it to me as soon as possible? I would be most grateful. The other copy is for you to keep for your records.


Incidentally, the book will have an introduction by Doctor Reinhold Niebuhr, Professor Emeritus of Christian Ethics at Union Theological Seminary.
