

Mississippi Report

March 10, 1965

Mr. Tolson,

Here is my first report on the Leflore Co. happenings. On ~~Friday~~^{Thursday} March 4, 1965 (Liala) Mrs. Grees' home was bombed by an explosive number of twelve bottles of Gas, which was thrown on the front porch of their home. No one was injured. One of the flames almost hit Mrs. Grees' granddaughter. fifteen of us went out in the snow to protest the bombing. We all wore picket signs. There were snow arrest. The Police and the sheriff came out to protect us, and we were intimidated by local whites.

Mr. Tolson, I would like very much to let you know everything that happens in Mississippi. I need a typewriter so that I can type up all the reports, and I can give you faster service. (Smile) I want to set up an office at the teachers' home of my own. The rooms there are \$10 a month. I have an sister living there already who have have two children a husband. At home I live with my mother two sisters three nieces and two nephews. We do not have enough room at home I shall a daughter

three years old, I lost the last one in Dec. because I
had been beaten by the police in July during our
freedom day. I need you ~~you~~ to write me or call
me at these number so that I can explain things
better to you. This is all in freedom. G-3-0427
