

Monday, Sept. 6: Al went over early in the morning to Farmhaven to check if they were registering kids, since there was some confusion about this. They weren't. Then we both went over to the Sharpsburg area to try arrange transportation to school for the two families there, got a Mr. Simmons to agree take them. Then went up to Mt. Zion to get transportation for them (these were the families we weren't able to get to the school to register on the official registration day: we'd heard they'd be let register on the first day of school if they had a good excuse for being late, and we intended to try register them anyway).

Tuesday, Sept. 7: Al drove me up to Mt. Zion, I picked up a borrowed car, and me plus two local cars drove 6 families down to the school to try register. Al went over to Sharpsburg to check if the transportation which was arranged Monday came through. It didn't, so he drove the children to school. Last night someone shot into the house of the Lindsey's. The 6 families trying to register were told to go see the Superintendent Mr. Robert Cox about it. Just as I picked up my load, the sheriff (or a deputy) came over to run me off some private property on which I was parked. Three families went in to Canton with me to see Cox: Mrs. George, Mrs. Anderson, and Mrs. Dawson. He told them he'd let them know after the board met.

Wednesday, Sept. 8: We took children to school, then went up to Mt. Zi to talk to 2 of the rest of the 6 families who hadn't seen Cox. They said they'd try to see him by Friday. Arranged transportation for the kids this time with a neighbor. Went to a county FDP meeting at St. John's.

Thursday, Sept. 9: Took the Henry's and Lindsey's down to talk to Mr. Cox about buses, as a formality for the suit. When back at Mr. Henry's he told us he planned to transfer his kids back to the Negro school, and so did Mr. Lindsey. Had a long argument with him: apparently they have gotten scared. Al Kamens left for back north in the afternoon, with his car,

Friday, Sept. 10: Nothing done all day, due to the intervention of Hurricane Betsy.

Saturday, Sept. 11: Green came by & asked me to get a car from Cantor & Jackson for the Washington trip. Went in to Canton, but couldn't get cars from either place. Cycled over to the Henry's & Lindsey's to talk some more about schools, got the run around, told Mrs. Lindsey would try transfer her kids to Madison school (another Wh School).

Sunday, Sept. 12: Went to Pleasant Green for church. Then in the late afternoon, showed an irate couple of Leake County workers over to Andrew Green's house, but he wasn't there, so their ire remained unsatisfied.
