Dear Mr. William:

Because of the retreat coming up, is it advisable to start a new program? I'm afraid to start on something new and can't finish by the time of the retreat, and I can't get back to finished because of a new assignment.

As we stated before, there are several resturants that need special attention. I am ready to start a daily sit-in.

I am asking you for advice about calling off the boycott downtown to a selective buying campaign since most of our demands have been met and I feel more will be met if we can get people to apply for certain "jobs".

We are rid of the two terrible policemen who once terrorized the black communities; we only have one black policeman who is new and who try to do right. We have three black operator (telephone), black folks working in stores, (2 or 3 worked at the cash registers during the summer, whether they worked there now is unknown, because those working were high school students), black folks or more working in industries which just formed Unions with the blacks help.

We hope to have better communication with Atlanta in the future, especially with you than in the past, knowing that you were busy working and campaigning for the November election.
