The discuss conditions, their own attitudes and those of their meighbors. Both are pretty hard on those apathetic or frearful amogn them. Especially one, the mother of eleven children, is highly intelligent, angry, proud, strongwilled. She is obsessed by the desire to learn wherever she has a chance and tries to instill the same in her children, many of whom come to our school.

I am now trying to instill in both of them a sense of responsibility they should have towards going beyond their very personal sphere and using their ability, their articulateness to influence people around them, become 2 of those leaders in the community of whom it needs so many and waits for so eagerly. I certainly want to recommend bothe women urgently to the attention of the staff as potentials for further and future development. They mitht give much more to us and their own than I may have been able to give to them in the way of grammar and spelling. Their names: Mrs. Amanda Folsom and Mrs. Alice Davidson. I close with regret because I know I shall miss this life and all people connected with it. I shall think back with affection and concern for all my fellow workers all over the State and also with hope for all those bright eyed **young** young people in our schools and penters.
