We have been advised by the authorities of *Barnard College* that you are not in attendance as a student at that institution during the *fall 62* semester. Under these circumstances your State scholarship is subject to forfeiture.

If you intend to make no further use of the scholarship, you should file a formal resignation at once.

We may grant you a leave of absence for satisfactory reasons for a period of not more than 24 months provided you obtain from the college authorities and file with us a formal certificate of leave, stating the cause of your absence and giving the exact date of the beginning of the absence.

If you are now serving in the armed forces you are entitled to a leave of absence for military service. This leave, when granted, will protect your State scholarship and will entitle you to reinstatement and to the unused benefits of this scholarship if your college education is resumed within eighteen months after honorable discharge.

Please advise us at once as to your intentions with regard to this matter. *Please reply within 15 days. Leave of absence forms enclosed for your use.*
