## COPY OF AFFIDAVIT

At about 8:30 p.m., June 14, 1964, Chief Guy appeared at my house. Evelyn Nelson, who was visiting me, answered the door. Chief Guy asked me who was going to bomb my house. I told him I didn't know anything. He said that I had called him but I hadn't. Then he left.

I went outside to talk to a neighbor. While I was talking to him, Sheriff Warren drove up and asked me if I were Julia Woods. I said I was, and he asked me, "What about this bombing of your home?" I said I didn't know anything about it. He said I had called him on the telephone. I insisted that I hadn't. Then he asked me if I had seen any C.O.F.O. people, or had any at my home. I told him I hadn't seen any C.O.F.O. people. He said, "Do you mean you didn't know C.O.F.O. was here?" I said I didn't. He asked me who I worked for and how long I had been there. His questions seemed to be trying to scare me, so that I wouldn't have anything to do with C.O.F.O.

From that night on, we sat up every night and watched the house.

I have held N.A.A.C.P. voter registration classes in my home.
