Being duly sworn deposes and says: to-wit: I am a citizen of the United States of America and am a Negro or a white participant in civil rights and desegregation work. On (day) Tuesday, (month) July, (date) 8, 1964, at about 10:30 AM time, the following happened:

I and Estella Jonnison (SP?) were going to Church Street, and Officer Sharp (of the Indianola Police) pulled up in the alley in Huff's Quarter and stopped near us. He said, "Hey there." "Is any of that white trash up in here?" I turned around in surprise and said, "What?" And then he smiled and repeated what he had said and added, "They is supposed to be working up in here." I said I haven't seen any of them (referring to "white trash"), but I saw two white people up here. He just drove off without saying anything.
