I went to Magnolia Mississippi to try to register and vote today, October 26, 1964. I was arrested along with 20 other people. Then I was under arrest; the officers told me if I didn't be quiet I would get the hell knocked out of me; I told him I did not have any hell in me, and that everything in me was good. One officer said you are not talking to President Johnson. I said I well knew that. I told him that I would stay in jail because I didn't have a house to live in because they had bombed my house. He said President Johnson would build me a house. I said I don't pay insurance to President Johnson. I asked them could I make a phone call; they told me if we be quiet I could. So we were quiet for a while but he didn't let us make calls. So, I said what you get for being quiet, nothing. He did not permit us to use the phone.
