






Two federal court cases resulted from the school protests. In Turner v. Goolsby, the court ruled that it was illegal to use public funds to bus white students to adjoining counties, while refusing to bus black students. The U.S. Supreme Court case Turner v. Fouche argued October 20, 1966, and decided January 19, 1970, changed the method used for selecting jurors and, subsequently, school board members.


